Where do we stand

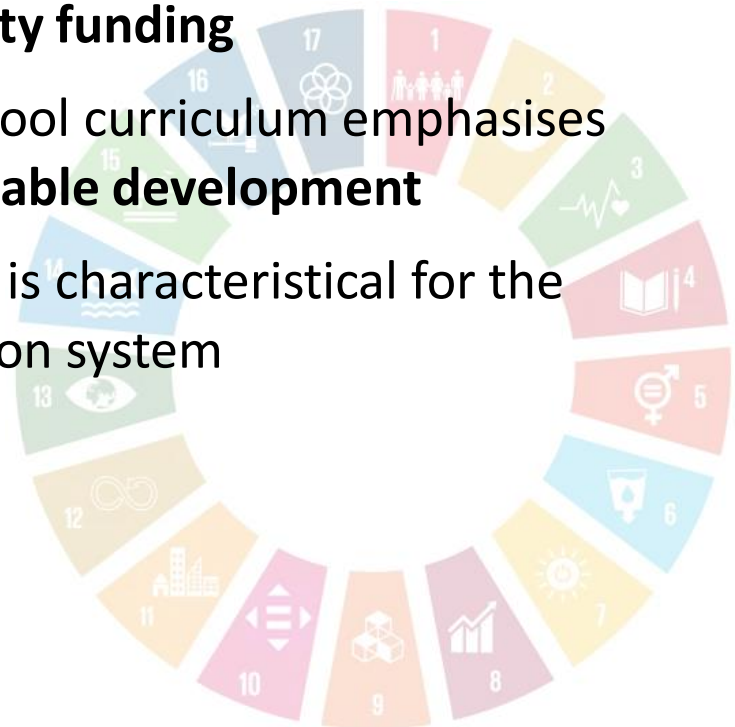
- Based on 69 indicators, **12 SDGs show a positive trend** – meaning we're moving towards more sustainability – and only three a negative one
- Sustainability dimensions are reflected in **Government programme 2021-2025**
- Each Government bill to Parliament contains an **SDG analysis**
- **Stakeholder survey** met with great interest; SDGs 11 and 13 amongst those SDGs with highest need for action





Quality education and decent jobs

- The new **2025+ Education Strategy** aims at enabling everyone to reach their full potential
- SDG 4 is the top thematic priority of our **international solidarity funding**
- The Liechtenstein school curriculum emphasises **education for sustainable development**
- **Educational diversity** is characteristic for the Liechtenstein education system

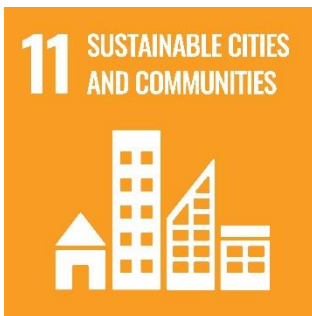
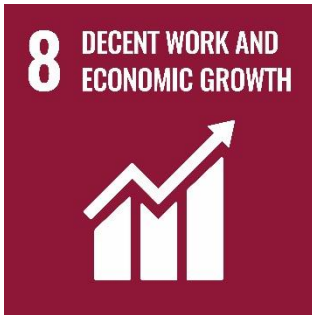

Economic growth and infrastructure

- **Unemployment rate** and youth employment rate are very low
- SDG 8 is another focus area with the **FAST initiative** as a flagship project (Financing against Slavery and Trafficking)
- **Number of jobs** in Liechtenstein exceeds the number of inhabitants
- 2030 Mobility Strategy aims at increasing **green transportation** choices





Decoupling CO₂ emissions from growth

- **Energy and CO₂ intensity** of our economy has been **declining**, yet an **estimated two thirds** of **greenhouse gas emissions** are produced **abroad**
- **2050 Climate Strategy** sets goal of **net zero** by 2050
- As part of **EIG (Environmental Integrity Group)** we regularly call for **more ambitious climate targets** at UNFCCC COPs
- Liechtenstein supported the UNGA resolution calling for an **ICJ advisory opinion** on the **obligations of States in respect of climate change**

- **Various strategies and action plans are being implemented**, effects not yet reflected in statistics
- Systematic evaluation of implementation progress requires **improvements in data situation**
- Continuing **constructive and close cooperation** between the State and stakeholders is key
